AECS is a non-profit non-governmental organization founded on May 20, 1996. It has been active for twenty-four years in the community with Social Projects in the areas of Health, Education, Culture, Leisure and Sports to create a better quality of life for its citizens. During all these years we have always been at the side of the most needy, since the community (FAVELA) Canal do Anil, like so many others in the city of Rio de Janeiro, suffers from the lack of public assistance policies. Our organization is considered one of the main examples of how to support a shanty town population. Our NGO is committed to working for their rights and the improvements of the quality of life of this population. We currently offer physiotherapy services (psychology, psychopedagogy, otorhinolaryngology, and, school reinforcement) as well as workshops (dance, theater, music, sport, reading support, physical therapy, and other activities).

With the onset of new coronavirus pandemic, our activities have been cancelled, but we remain on the front line educating the population in the prevention of COVID-19. This work is being developed in partnership with the Favela Vertical Collective Movement, which joined our NGO to promote health education concerning the virus in the community, as well as distribution of basic baskets (food and cleaning products) to low-income families. Since March, our community has also been affected with many positive cases of COVID-19. Unfortunately, there has been some loss of loved ones. Others were hospitalized and managed to recover. Among these was our friend Maria Calé de Lima who is part of the NGO'S board of directors and Renata Santos Carvalho, one of our physiotherapists. Both, fought hard for life and today are recovering. Going through this crisis has not been easy because the Public Health System of the city of Rio de Janeiro, as well as that of other cities of Brasil (and the Federal Government), were not prepared to give adequate assistance for COVID-19. We continue to hope for this pandemic to pass.

After all these months of battling the Coronavirus, we are better prepared for the return of some activities, when possible without risk. Most of our participants are children and adolescents, about 150-200. We are putting together a strategy for this return, with the support of our psychology professionals. We realize that the pandemic has created much emotional distress among the children, as well as parents. The activities will be developed in small groups, including workshop monitors, children, adolescents, and their families. The goal of this work is to minimize all the suffering that everyone is experiencing at this time. With no government assistance, we have depended solely on the kindness of those who know of our work.

We thank you for your support. God bless you all! We choose to believe!

I hope you can appreciate what our NGO is doing in the Rio community and can help them get through this devastating time. By helping with their struggle, we are able to give hope for a better life in the future – for all of us.

Loss of jobs is a crisis in favelas (Shantytowns) because of the types of jobs available to this community. One of the top priorities of AECS (Association of Community Health Educator Agents) during the pandemic is to ensure no family goes hungry.

Donations to the Brazilian Fund will be used for the following:

- **providing meals for all families impacted by COVID, directly or indirectly**
- **providing for the Physical Therapy program costs not covered by the city, such as maintenance of equipment and salary for the PT coordinator**
- **providing support for the children's project and salary for the coordinator and part time assistants to enrich the children's program**
- **providing material used for the activities of the children's program including a meal**
- **providing financial aid for the programs that benefit of the community (These programs are not considered a part of the City's Family Health Program, so no Government financial support is given.)**
