Pastor's Page

The Holy Earth is a lovely little book from a bygone century. Published in 1915 by Liberty Hyde Bailey, it recalls the beauty and wonder of creation in an era when respect for the land was stronger. Today the title alone is jarring; long ago the holiness, the sacredness of the earth faded significantly.

The 52nd celebration of Earth Day is upon us, reminding us that much remains to be done to

recover a sense of living on and with the *holy* earth, even as it faces dramatic and potentially catastrophic change.

Caring for creation, of course, is a life-long call and commitment for Christians, a mark of faithfulness, not just a designated day or month. Over generations, though, our own sense of the holy, sacred earth has diminished, worn down by the cultural and economic realities that dominate the contemporary global community and the dramatic shift of people off the land.

In our own homes and in the church today, we are and must be on a life-giving journey toward more sustainable living. Along with our neighboring churches and community partners working together at the Hope for Creation table we are making a difference. There are always new possibilities for action and learning before us, there is much to do, and much is being done.

But even as we strive anew to care for creation in this turbulent era, we cannot let *tasks* and good works overwhelm our deepest sense of reverence for the holy creation. We are in so many ways a human family that seeks to fix things, to build, to have, to improve, to change; in our busyness it is easy to overlook the sheer beauty and magnificence of the creation we seek to sustain.

We live on the northern edge of a spectacular, unglaciated land mass encompassing 57 counties of rolling hills, bluffs, rivers, and

forests in four states. The Driftless Area is a unique gem of creation. Head out of River Falls on County O or take the highways down the Great River or through bluff country, and be amazed and humbled once again. While the holy earth is always outside our own windows, its beauty truly defies words as we head south. Look and see.

Creation stories of cultures and religions around the world are wondrous. The stirring words of Genesis still evoke our reverence. In 1968, when those verses were read from Apollo 8 as it captured the Christmas Eve earthrise from space, the world was—and still is—stunned and stilled, a gift we direly need in this time.

Long ago Liberty Hyde Bailey wrote that "The sacredness to us of the earth is intrinsic and inherent. If God created the earth, so is the earth hallowed; and if it is hallowed, so must we deal with it devotedly and with care that we do not despoil it, and mindful of our relations to all beings that live on it."

Might it be so. -Pastor Dave


Last Faith at Home Bag

All of us want to do something to help and be Jesus' loving disciples in the present moment. Below are some specific things you can do at home:

Shut-ins/Seniors: We have connected our seniors/shut-ins with church families who send them notes, small parcels and kid's artwork. If you want to be matched with a shut-in, contact the church office.
