Pastor's Page

It feels really good to be coming out of the pandemic, though we know that it has by no means been vanquished, especially at the global level. Summer lies before us and the ongoing openness of our communities and country bring a renewed sense of joy and gratitude. In many ways, however, the challenges of the coming period are as daunting as those of the recent past. As the "boundaries" of the pandemic fade, the open ground ahead of us is uncertain and shaky. What may have once been "normal" may no longer be, and a "new normal" is yet to take shape, if at all. The turbulence of economies, employment, politics, race relations, and civil society continue to unnerve. It will likely be months or even years before the proverbial dust settles.

God is still speaking

The role and the work of the church—the community of faith in helping shape the days ahead is as critical as was our rising to meet the dramatic challenges and needs of the past year. We adapted. We worshipped every Sunday. We gave generously to help those in great need. We reached out and supported one another. We provided ongoing learning opportunities. We engaged as we were able in works of justice. We listened and learned and responded as conditions shifted.

Now we are compelled to look ahead, to look anew. In churches everywhere there lingers the question: will people come back? Will they participate in shared worship and in the pressing work of ministry, outreach, education, and community engagement? Will churches nurture and strengthen deep and abiding relationships so essential to community life and well-being? Or will they fall back on "old ways" as unfolding cultural shifts make it easier to "observe" church instead of participating with it, or see it as a place to escape the world instead of changing it?

The most fundamental question, however, remains: how are we to be the church in the world?

The story of Abraham, who "set out, not knowing where he was going" is amazingly pertinent and powerful to our own day and time, as are all the stories of all the peoples of God who journeyed unknowing and uncertain into the future, driven by faith.

There will be changes ahead. There will be new ways of being the church. There will be ongoing challenges. There will be untold opportunities to create a new way of life and living that reflect the call of God through Jesus Christ even in our own time.

As the year(s) ahead unfold, our commitment *together* to shape and grow an ever-stronger beloved community in a new and unknown and uncertain era is foundational to who we are and to who we will be as a people of God.

This may be a singular opportunity of our lifetimes to do so. Let us move ahead with joy and thanksgiving and faith, driven by a vision of hope and wholeness, of community and joy, of justice and openness.

Mission Partner: Feed My Starving Children

On March 16 last year, Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) shut down its operations in the face of the pandemic. Nine days later the organization started up again, with machines at one of its main suppliers bulk-packing its food for global distribution. By August, approved safety measures allowed FMSC to re-open volunteer food packing sessions, and its rooms were alive once again with

the joy of volunteers doing good together. By February 2021, FMSC hit a record 45 million meals shipped in a single month.

Our church has a long relationship with FMSC, sending dozens upon dozens of youth and adult volunteers to package food at its nearby Minnesota facilities and providing Mission budget funds to support its global operations: \$1,400 in 2021.

Founded in 1987 the Christian nonprofit partners with organizations around the world to reach children in great need in schools, orphanages, medical clinics and feeding programs in 70 countries, to break the cycle of poverty. Its U.S. food packing operations now draw thousands of volunteers to sites in eight states.

FMSC produces three special MannaPack meal formulas developed by food science and nutrition professionals to supplement nutritional needs and reduce problems with malnutrition. This past February the organization quietly hit a major milestone of <u>3 billion meals</u> distributed throughout the world.

In the coming months we will again "hit the road" in our new church van and/or other vehicles (we've been known to take a school bus!) to volunteer at the Minnesota food packing facility.
