Come and Be Fed

Sometimes it feels like we are living in a real live version of the movie Groundhog Day. In that movie, Bill Murray keeps living the same day over and over and over. It is a funny movie and worth your time, but somehow living it does not seem very funny right now. In fact some days are just difficult. This pandemic has gone on longer than anyone wanted or imagined. Even

the strongest and most faithful among us are getting weary of it all. How are we going to face it all, including an uncertain future and fall? We will face it in faith and let Iesus feed us.

For many summer Sundays now the gospel lessons have been taken from John 6 in which Jesus talks about feeding his people. John 6 is a really long chapter that begins with Jesus feeding the 5000 with just 5 loaves and 2 fish. After Iesus blesses and breaks the food. so many are fed out of so little that there are leftovers. And then in the rest of John 6, Jesus goes on and on and on about feeding people on two things: The Word of God, Jesus teaching to them, and the Bread of Life, Jesus' own body and blood, what we call the sacrament of holy communion. We too need to be fed.

Last fall our theme was Pivot! as we shifted and moved sometimes weekly to adjust to the changing realities of the pandemic. All that pivoting has left us exhausted. Now, we just want to be fed. We need to be fed. So come and be fed this fall.

Inside this newsletter you can find a whole section with ways you can be fed. Alex and Sarah Plum, our new Youth Ministers will be leading new Wednesday evening and Sunday Youth Groups for Middle and High School students. Pastor Stacy will be leading a weekly Bible Study. A series of cooking classes will feed our hunger to be together in safe, small groups and learn new culinary skills. Music programs can feed the deepest parts of our souls and bless others when that gift is shared. Pastor Dave is working on more gatherings of the Learning Community. So come and be fed.

Sundays will look a little different this fall. For now, starting on Rally Day, we will run one worship service in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 am with Sunday School (Pre-K to 8th Grade) to run concurrently and Coffee Fellowship to follow at 11:00 am (see Rally Day Schedule later). And based on feedback we received this summer from the Parents Meetings, we will move communion earlier in the service so kids can commune before leaving for Sunday School. Finally, starting with Rally Day, and with the Deacons' blessing, we will be offering communion every week. So come and be fed.

The good news is that we are not alone. In fact we are never alone. God is with us equipping us with faith to get us through the stressful times of life. In John 10:10, Jesus offers his mission statement: *I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly.* Led by our faith, fed at Christ's table, let us move into the fall in confidence and compassion, grace and peace.

Ways to Reach Out to Others

All of us want to do something to help and be Jesus' loving disciples in the present moment. Below are some specific things you can do at home:

Shut-ins/Seniors—We have connected our seniors/shut-ins with church families who send them notes, small parcels and kid's artwork. If you want to be matched with a shut-in, contact the church office.

Donations for Shut In Bags—One of the good things to come out the pandemic are the 25 shut in bags that are delivered each month by volunteers. We are looking for donations of small gifts or handmade items that can be put in these gift bags. Home baked cookies, small handmade items, even seasonal dollar store items are all great additions to this ministry, but there must be 25 of them. Contact the church office for more info.

Compassion Fund—There are families in our church who have been furloughed, fired, and laid off. We will be able to offer some modest assistance to these families through our church Compassion Fund. Gifts should be mailed to the church and marked 'Compassion Fund.' Families who need assistance, please contact Pastor Chris.

Prayer—Prayer connects us with God and our neighbors. Pray for the helpers. Pray for your families. Pray for people losing their jobs. Pray for students learning online. Pray for families learning new routines. Pray for people cooped up inside. Each week there is a prayer list of people, situations and thanksgivings that is sent out by email to help people in their prayer life. You can sign up by contacting the church office.
