As Jesus' courageous disciples, living God's grace, we strive to:

I like the story because, among other things, it challenges me to be not just thankful, but to be grateful. It challenges me not just to acknowledge my many blessings, but to act on them.

One of the things I have noticed during this strange and lengthy Covid time, is the amazing ability of people of faith to find blessings amidst the hardships. This is a good thing! God is at work even in a pandemic. To be able to see some blessing in it at all, is an amazing act of faith. And I know from my conversations, so many of you have been able to find blessings amidst the burdens of Covid. Yet the Christian faith does not call us to collect blessings, but to share them. We are called not just to count our blessings, but to live gratefully by sharing them with others.

I am amazed at the many ways we as a congregation try to live this out. In August we shared news and pictures of our school supply give away, supporting over 300 local kids. In September we shared news and pictures of the college packs given away to our

39 college folk. We also started a new Youth Group Ministry for both Middle and High School kids. This month we celebrate the return of Among Friends, Wednesday School and Wednesday Night Family Meals. Next month we look forward to the annual Giving Thanks meal, even if we are not yet sure the form it will take. This church understands that it has been blessed and tries to share those blessings with others.

In the coming weeks, you will receive a pledge card asking you to make a financial commitment to support the ministry of our church. I ask four things of you. First, if you do not already pledge, I ask you to start this year. Pledging is the only way we can know what ministries we as a church can fully fund. Second, if you have pledged in the past, thank you! You are part of the engine that drives this ministry. I ask you to please increase your pledge, even if just a little bit. Third, if you have not already done so, please sign up for e-giving. It is safe, simple and

> easy to enroll (look for an enrollment form in the mail, on the website or contact the church office). You never have to write a check again!

making significant and lasting contribution to the University and its campus communities.



First Communion Information for Parents

When do children at First Congregational Church begin taking Communion?

There is no uniform age at First Congregational Church when children begin participating in the Lord's Supper. Some children are pre-school age, others are in elementary school, and some wait until confirmation to begin taking Communion. The Bible and church history do not give decisive guidelines about the age to begin celebrating the Lord's Supper. The decision about when people are welcome at the Lord's Table has largely been made by local worshipping communities. Our practice is to include children when they and their parents think they are ready to participate.

How will I know when my child is ready?

Some parents choose infant communion for their children. Many parents wait until their children express an interest. Typically, children are ready to participate in Communion when they start asking questions about this sacrament. One important theme of Communion is inclusion: All are welcome at the table of the Lord. If a child feels excluded, it is a good time for that child to begin participating.

My child does not yet receive Communion. Should she/he still come forward?

Yes, all people are invited to come forward to the servers at the Communion distribution time. Children who will not be communing should keep their hands folded (as opposed to reaching out). This is a signal to the pastor and deacons that the child desires a blessing.
