

SCRIPTURE LESSON: Philippians 4:4-9

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

GOSPEL LESSON: Luke 3:7-18

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages."

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.



Sharing Our Blessings With An Attitude Of Gratitude 2021 Year End Gifting Opportunities

This is the time of year when many of us consider offering charitable contributions to our favorite organizations, in gratitude for the impact these organizations have on our life. We hope that you consider First Congregational Church an important part of your life. Here are a few ideas to help you know the impact your giving can have on you and our congregation. Whether you choose to designate your year-end financial support to our general fund (annual operating budget) or to help retire our building debt, please know that your generosity is valued, appreciated, and most certainly needed at this time.

Cash Gifts

A contribution of cash or check is the simplest way to offer a financial commitment from your assets or income. If you choose to itemize deductions, your contribution could be included each year.

Electronic Payment of Your Commitment

First Congregational Church provides automatic Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) for your convenience. Our EFT process is like payment programs offered by utilities and health care providers. Your contribution is automatically withdrawn from a regular checking, savings, or credit union account, but ONLY with your authorization.

Appreciated Property

You may find that a gift of common stock, bonds, mutual funds, other securities, appreciated property, donor advised funds, real estate holdings, a personal residence, a second home, or other land, could offer a significant tax savings. You may be able to avoid the tax on your gains <u>and</u> deduct the value as a charitable contribution.

Age 70.5 or Older – Qualified Charitable Distribution • Age 72 or Older – Required Minimum Distribution

Anyone age 70.5 or older can take a Qualified Charitable Distribution from their Individual Retirement (IRA) account. Those age 72 or older **must** take a Required Minimum Distribution from their IRA each year. In either situation, you may directly transfer your IRA funds to First Congregational Church. Specifically, a donor may offer a direct/outright gift each year (in any amount up to \$100,000 for individuals and \$200,000 for couples) from his/her/their IRA account, and the distribution will be excluded from gross income for tax purposes. Those who own a Roth IRA can also benefit from this strategy.

Commodities

For some farmers, offering a contribution of dairy, grain, or livestock rather than cash, can increase the tax benefit of the gift. The tax consequences of the gift differ depending on whether the donor is an active farmer or a landlord.

Employer Matching Funds

We invite you to consult with your employer to determine whether a matching gift from your company can double the value of your contribution to our congregation.

Good Counsel Is Essential

The information presented is not intended to be legal advice. Your contribution may or may not be tax deductible, depending on how the current tax law impacts your circumstances. We encourage you to seek the counsel of your financial planner and/or tax advisor. He/she can help you to determine the most tax-wise method of offering your financial contribution, while satisfying your financial planning needs. First Congregational Church reserves the right to decline any contribution if it would not be in its best interests to accept it.



Free Money for Church Ministries

The church has created an Amazon Smile account through which the church can receive a portion of the price of each purchase you make though Amazon. It is important to know that you need to do two things for the church to receive this money. First, go to Amazon Smile by typing in smile.amazon.com and then add First Congregational Church River Falls to your Amazon Smile. Second, every time you order you must order through your Smile account by going to smile.amazon.com. Once you do this, the church will receive 0.5% of each eligible order. Please contact the church office if you have questions.

Last quarter the church received over \$200.00 for this account, but that amount could grow greatly if you add the church to your Amazon account. Do it today!
