A Good Question

Have you ever noticed that when Jesus was teaching, his most effective method was by asking a question? I recently read a fabulous book by UCC author and pastor Martin Copenhaver called Jesus is the Question: The 307 Questions Jesus asked and the 3 He Answered. Copenhaver makes the point that rather than giving his followers a list of things to do and facts to remember, Jesus told stories and parables. Rather than reciting long lists of commandments for his followers to memorize, Jesus asked them questions and told them stories. The goal of both question and parable was the same—to elicit new understanding. Put simply, Jesus' goal was not to give more information, but to transform people's lives. In a world in which we are so inundated with information, I find this helpful.

Taking a cue from Jesus, this Lent we are going to wrestle with some of the big questions of faith and life. Starting on Ash Wednesday and going all the way through Easter we will take a cue from Jesus and dive deep into scripture, unpack stories and help us answer the questionwhat does Jesus want us to do today? During our Wednesday Lenten services, Prayer Around the Cross, we will take Sunday's question and help answer it by praying and singing together, as well as hearing some of our most beloved children's stories along with some new stories. Together may we grow in faith and love this Lent.

A Shift on Masking in Church

With the quick decrease in local Covid infections, church leaders are carefully monitoring the local situation with regard to masking and church life. As we write this, local schools will remove mask requirements on February 28 and UWRF on March 11. Fewer masks are seen in stores, yet many businesses have still not called workers back to the office. We are all tired of masking and want this to be over.

This past Friday the CDC changed its mask guidance based on local conditions. In Pierce County last week there were less than 50 Covid cases down from over 750 at the beginning of January. There have been no deaths since early January and hospitalizations continue to fall. It is time to change.

Starting Monday, February 28 the church will no longer require masks inside the church building. Masks will still be available by the church entrance and on the sign up table for those who wish to use them. The online and radio worship options will continue indefinitely. We know some of you were ready for this change a long time ago, and others of you



will receive this news with unease. Please continue to pray for church leaders as they monitor local conditions and seek to keep us both faithful and safe in our common ministry. But most of all let us treat one another with love, grace and compassion which are three of our 12 church discipleship traits.

What the Pastor is Reading

Ordinary Saints by Rev. George Ault tells the story of the ordinary people who do the work of God in our community and world. Written by a UCC pastor in Arizona and reflecting back on his 50+ years of ministry his words are simple and evocative. A copy is in the church library.

Facing the Mountain by Daniel James Brown (who also wrote **Boys in the Boat** about the rowing team from the University of Washington who went on to compete in the Munich Olympics), tells the story of Japanese Americans from Hawaii and the West Coast who were interred during World War 2. It includes wonderful stories of courage, faith and patriotism especially from those internees who went on to form the 442nd combat team who became the most decorated unit in the World War 2. A wonderful companion to the book our own Callie Trautmiller wrote a few years ago **Becoming American**.

The Late Home Comer: A Hmong Family Memoir by Kao Kalia Yang tells the author's story as she and her family flee Laos after the Vietnam conflict and settle in St Paul. A wonderful immigration story which tells how the immigration experience affects people. Yang is now a professor at Carleton College in Northfield, MN. A copy is in the church library.

Saving Us: A Climate Scientists Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World by Katharine Hayhoe is written by a Canadian, Christian climatologist who is married to an evangelical pastor and teaches in Waco, Texas (bet you wonder how all those things work together). A wonderful book that offers exactly what is says—hope and healing as we face climate change. A copy is in the church library.

First Communion Information for Parents

When do children at First Congregational Church begin taking Communion?

There is no uniform age at First Congregational Church when children begin participating in the Lord's Supper. Some children are pre-school age, others are in elementary school, and some wait until confirmation to begin taking Communion. The Bible and church history do not give decisive guidelines about the age to begin celebrating the Lord's Supper. The decision about when people are welcome at the Lord's Table has largely been made by local worshipping communities. Our practice is to include children when they and their parents think they are ready to participate.

How will I know when my child is ready?

Some parents choose infant communion for their children. Many parents wait until their children express an interest. Typically, children are ready to participate in Communion when they start asking questions about this sacrament. One important theme of Communion is inclusion: All are welcome at the table of the Lord. If a child feels excluded, it is a good time for that child to begin participating.

My child does not yet receive Communion. Should she/he still come forward?

Yes, all people are invited to come forward to the servers at the Communion distribution time. Children who will not be communing should keep their hands folded (as opposed to reaching out). This is a signal to the pastor and deacons that the child desires a blessing.
