Pastor's Page

Jane Goodall has a new book out, appropriately called, <u>The Book</u> of Hope: A Survival Guide for <u>Trying Times</u>. In her book she tells this story.

It seems a month after the 9/11 attacks in New York City, workers were clearing away the debris of that horrible day when they found the remains of a Callery Pear tree. This poor tree was crushed between two blocks of concrete.

Its roots were broken, half its trunk was charred black. In fact there was only one living branch left on the whole tree. A recovery worker found it, asked that it not be sent to the dump, but given a chance to survive. So it was taken to the New York City Botanical Garden to see what they could do. There was little reason to believe that lifeless tree could be saved, but as Jane Goodall writes: whenever you give her a chance, nature returns, nature surprises you.

That charred tree not only survived, it thrived. In just seven years it grew 20 feet. It grew so much that it was re-planted at the 9/11 Memorial site and has come to be known as the Survivor Tree. You can see a picture of the Survivor Tree in full bloom in your bulletin today.

What makes this story even more powerful and appropriate on this Easter Sunday, is that every year seedlings from that tree are given to three communities that have endured unspeakable tragedy. Seedlings from that Survivor Tree are growing in Newtown, Connecticut outside Sandy Hook Elementary. Seedlings from that Survivor Tree are growing in Charleston, South Carolina, near Emmanuel AME church. Seedlings of the Survivor Tree

are growing in Pittsburg, near the Tree of Life Synagogue. Seedlings from that Survivor Tree are growing in Gulfport, Mississippi, where Hurricane Katrina washed over that community. And this year seedlings from the Survivor Tree are rumored to be heading to Ukraine.

What I find so powerful about this story, is not just that the tree survived, but that it keeps on giving, despite all the trauma. Despite all it has been through, it keeps on giving, it keeps on blessing others, it keeps on giving people hope. Hope that all the evil can somehow be overcome. Hope that violence will not have the last word. The Survivor Tree is a good image for us on this Easter of 2022, because you and I are survivors.



Church Scholarship Reminder



Sustainability Tip

As Spring slowly rolls in, so will lawn and garden season. Before applying fertilizer or other products to your lawn or garden this year, consider testing the soil first to check the basic nutrient levels. Many lawn care companies do this as a service, or you can collect a sample yourself and send it in to a soils laboratory. Contact your local Pierce County Extension Office for a sampling kit or for more information by visiting or calling Extension Pierce County Office Building, 412 West Kinne Street, Ellsworth, 715-273-6781. The soil test results may surprise you; your lawn may not need any fertilizer or other products at all. If you do apply products, seek out only the products that your soil test recommends, and try to keep them within the bounds of your lawn. Fertilizer and other products inadvertently applied to concrete or asphalt surfaces can be washed away into the nearest lake or stream when it rains, negatively affecting water quality. -Brought to you by the Mission Education Committee and the Care for Creation Crew

First Communion Information for Parents

When do children at First Congregational Church begin taking Communion?

There is no uniform age at First Congregational Church when children begin participating in the Lord's Supper. Some children are pre-school age, others are in elementary school, and some wait until confirmation to begin taking Communion. The Bible and church history do not give decisive guidelines about the age to begin celebrating the Lord's Supper. The decision about when people are welcome at the Lord's Table has largely been made by local worshipping communities. Our practice is to include children when they and their parents think they are ready to participate.

How will I know when my child is ready?

Some parents choose infant communion for their children. Many parents wait until their children express an interest. Typically, children are ready to participate in Communion when they start asking questions about this sacrament. One important theme of Communion is inclusion: All are welcome at the table of the Lord. If a child feels excluded, it is a good time for that child to begin participating.

My child does not yet receive Communion. Should she/he still come forward?

Yes, all people are invited to come forward to the servers at the Communion distribution time. Children who will not be communing should keep their hands folded (as opposed to reaching out). This is a signal to the pastor and deacons that the child desires a blessing.
