Be Still. What do you think of when you hear these words? Be Still. If only I could do that, I have so much to do! Be Still. My life is so boring, if I were any more still I'm not sure I would be alive! Be Still. Why should I be still when I can game, watch Netflix and hang with friends? Be Still. Sitting still is a waste, there is so much I need to do! Be Still. I'm afraid to be still, afraid of the silence, afraid of what I might hear. Be Still. This year, our Wednesday Lenten theme for our Prayer Around the Cross Lenten Worship is Be Still. The words are taken from Psalm 46 which begins with these words:

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in times of trouble.

Therefore we will not fear, though the world should change, though the mountains shake.., though its waters roar... Come, behold the works of the Lord... Be still, and know that I am God... the Lord is with us, the God of Jacob is our refuge.

The fact of the matter is. modern life is anything but still. The world is changing, too fast for some of us, not fast enough for others. Most, though not all of us, feel we have too much to do and too little time to get it done. Some of us feel like we have too much time on our hands and not enough direction or focus. ## **AAUW Honors Ann Gustafson**

At its January 21 meeting, the River Falls Association of University Women (AAUW) honored Ann Gustafson for her more than 50 years of leadership and service at the local, state and national levels.

Ann served as president of the River Falls branch, president of the state association and sat on many national boards and committees. Ann was instrumental in establishing the Legacy Circle throughout the upper midwest region to support the continuation of the research and advocacy initiatives of AAUW.



## UCC and Wisconsin Roots for Underground Railroad

One of the most astonishing stories in US history is that of the Underground Railroad, that quiet network of people stretching from the deep South to the Upper Midwest and New England, aiding escaping slaves in their treacherous, dangerous quest for freedom. Over four decades some 100,000 people traveled hundreds of miles along the abolitionist network that weaved through safe shelters in private homes, churches, river caves, barns and outbuildings and into Canada.

One of the northernmost Underground Railroad stops was Union Congregational Church, United Church of Christ in Green Bay. In 1855 a family of escaped slaves was sheltered in the church's belfry after their pursuers found them protected by a local indigenous community. The family stayed at the church until a steamer arrived to transport them safely to Canada. Founded in 1836 as First Presbyterian Church, the deeply abolitionist congregation included among its early membership an enslaved woman. In 1899 the church became Union Congregational, and has since been recognized by the National Network to Freedom, one of over 700 sites nationwide compromising the Underground Railroad. Today the congregation continues its historic commitments to racial justice.

The courage and bravery of those who traveled the Underground Railroad is remarkable and hard to fathom in our time, as is the commitment and faithfulness of those who sheltered them on their dangerous journey to freedom. Their long-ago stories are notable benchmarks for those of us in this century, seeking to be faithful to the call of our holy texts to justice. For Green Bay's Union Congregational UCC and for all those who created, sustained, and traveled the Underground Railroad, we give deep thanks.

H4C grew out of the 2-part discussion (and dinner, of course!) between about 40 First Congregational Church's and St. Bridget Church's members of the Pope's encyclical on Climate Change and Poverty, initiated by our own Rev. Dave Ostendorf and Father Jerry. Although both Rev. Dave and Father Jerry have moved on, their leadership helped make the on-going ecumenical success of H4C possible. #### **CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY JANUARY 17, 2023**

**Treasurer's Report:** Missy reported that the accounts ended the year with a positive balance of 223.43. All bills were paid in full, all missions were paid in full. During the Trustees meeting, there were questions about the figures for payroll. Most positions were paid less than budgeted. Missy verified that Jamie works in two positions and was paid in full. There were positions that were not fully staffed for the whole year. Missy also reports there have been continued issues with some miscoding done by the bookkeeping firm.

#### New Business:

**Reports and Accounting:** Missy and Chris report that some work on budget and account was easier when it was completed with-in the office. The Among Friends Board has acquired a volunteer to assist them with their budgeting and tracking of grants. The bookkeeper has been doing a good job on the payroll but not on the reports and accounts. Difficult to find someone who is qualified and knows QuickBooks. The position is very part-time and difficult. (discussion to be continued).

**2023 Budget:** Louie - trustees did not get through the budget so it is not approved at this time. They scheduled another meeting for next Tuesday to give Louie additional time to obtain more information on specific accounts. Council discussion occurred that according to the congregation bylaws the approved budget must be provided to the congregation 2 weeks prior to the annual meeting. After full Council discussion: a Motion was made to pass a tentative 2023 budget pending the review of the full trustees committee. (Passed by Council.)

**2022** Annual Meeting–Joel and Kathy – Agenda - reviewed and approved. Food: Decision made to serve cheese and meat trays, fresh fruit and council members to provide pans of bars. Presentations: Presenters identified for following committee presentations: CE, Deacons, Discipleship, EG, Mission, Music, Trustees, Welcoming, PTB, Music and Welcoming.

#### Old Business:

WCUCC and Bay Mission Capital Campaign Request Follow Up—Discussion on fine tuning presentation at annual meeting for a total of \$20,000 for both campaigns. We have 1/4 already seeded in the funds.

Capital Campaign Update-Sign - Tim B, Louie F, Chris M, Kathy R, Andy K - No updates. Sound - Joel L, Mike S, Jeff H, Dave R, Chris M - Meeting to be scheduled.

**Roof Update** - Roofers are currently working on the addition. Sanctuary work may not be completed until spring. Ice dams are a concern there so that will also be worked on at that point.

Church Van Update - Detailing-work is occurring at this time.

#### **Ministry Updates**

**Christian Education**-Annual meeting-Stacy will present. Ideas for goals were discussed. Programming is going well. Cardboard City is January 28th.

**Deacons**-Inquirers class will take place next week. One goal for the committee is an Emergency Preparedness plan. They identified that it is very slippery in the entrance area. New rugs for that area have been ordered here next week for both main entrances. During the discussion about entrance safety, there was a suggestion and discussion about having an intern and or/welcoming/trustees to assist elderly members out on the sidewalk. They are purchasing new candles for the altar and cleaning old wax.

**Mission Education**-Earth Fest plan for a table with spiritual resource materials, Lisa Hart (from Conference) will provide a presentation next month on WISE at 5 pm for dinner. Asking Council members to attend. Mission Moments will begin next week, Giving Tree for Our Neighbor's Place for Lent.

Music-Working on finding a date for the spring concert. RF Days kickoff event, fall events are being planned. Organ was tuned.

**Trustees**-Lawn tractor was repaired. There is discussion to consider a capital campaign fund to purchase a new one as they are approximately \$15,00-\$20,000. Feb 18th-winter clean-up day is scheduled with back up day of Feb 25th.

Welcoming Ministry-Joy Seekers are supported. New member introductions and support ideas. Gift bag supply lists getting copied.

**Pastor** - Jack Merner, former pastor, died in December at 102 years old. The congregation sent a condolence card. The 4 pm Christmas Eve service was very full (200+ attendees), small number at 11 pm and normal number of attendees for Christmas Day service. The Reverse Advent Calendar program with 25 days of food for the Food Pantry provided about 1500 pounds of food. Great idea from Larry Peterson and the Mission Committee. Wednesday night meals are on pause until Ash Wednesday. The Back Bay trip will be small this year. 12 will be attending rather than the usual 24 because it conflicts with the school band trip. The Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday Feb 5. Each committee provides two to three minutes of highlights/goals in 2022.
