Pastor's Page

As I write this our church building is simply buzzing. It is day two of Vacation Bible School which is one of the highlights of the church summer season (see pictures later in this newsletter). And since it is Tuesday, the Yoga group is meeting and our Among Friends program for those dealing with dementia is in session. Literally every space in the building is being used today and it is glorious.

Think about those three programs for a bit: VBS, Yoga and Among Friends. In the grand scheme of life, these are really quite modest endeavors. None of these by themselves will solve some of the big scary problems our world is facing. But what they do accomplish is bringing people together. VBS brings together an incredibly rich variety of ages and people. When you add the number of kids, volunteers and helpers who participate, it is well over a hundred people who learn, laugh and serve together. Plus, with Among Friends meeting here today, we have some of the oldest and youngest church folk interacting with each other, each appreciating and learning from one another. This is counter cultural stuff folks. But it doesn't just happen. Someone stepped up and acted.

One of the most famous of Jesus' miracles was the feeding of the 5000, often call the Miracle of Loaves and Fishes. Do you remember the story? It is found in all four gospels (Matthew 14, Mark 6, Luke 9, John 6) and it recalls the time a large crowd of people gathered to hear Jesus preach and teach. Evening came and there was not enough food to eat so the disciples urged Jesus to send the people away to buy their own food in the surrounding towns. Instead Jesus challenged

the disciples to feed them even though they only had a few loaves and fishes. And yet by the end of the evening, all had been fed and there were more leftovers than they started out with. The miracle shows not just Jesus' power, but also the hidden power God has placed in Jesus' followers.

All the programs I listed above started out as just a few loaves and fishes, something humble and relatively modest. And yet with God's blessing they have become true gifts.

Our yoga group gifts a core group of twenty or so people with healthy minds and bodies.

Our Among Friends group gifts families dealing with dementia with some well needed peace and a healthy place to leave their loved one.

And VBS, well where else in our world today do 3 and 93 year olds come together to learn and laugh together?

Again, all of these programs grew out of a few loaves and fishes, the offerings of people's time, talent and treasure that with God's blessing have become life-giving ministries. So how might God be calling you to use your simple loaf or small fish in God's service?

A Message from your UCC "Green Team"

Creation is our gift from God. We hope to give you ideas that help everyone to care for God's gift of planet earth, our common home. "Going Green" doesn't have to be a daunting task that means sweeping life changes. Simple things can make a difference. The ideas we offer may not be new, but they bear repeating. Sometimes it takes a few reminders for things to take root.

USE BOTH SIDES OF PAPER: U.S. businesses and home offices throw away 21 million tons of paper every year, equal to 175 pounds per office worker. Students can be taught reasonable paper usage too. Set your printer's default option to print double-sided (duplex printing). And when culling your paperwork and files, remember to take them to the recycling bin.

RETHINK BOTTLED WATER: Nearly 90% of plastic water bottles are not recycled, instead taking thousands of years to decompose. Buy a reusable container and fill it with tap water, a great choice for the environment, your wallet, and possibly your health. The EPAs standards for tap water are more stringent than the FDA's standards for bottled water. Wash your reusable containers by hand to prevent plastics from breaking down in the dishwasher.

DON'T PREHEAT THE OVEN: Unless you are making bread or pastries of some sort, don't pre-heat the oven. Just turn it on when you put the dish in. Also when checking on your food, look through the oven window instead of opening the door.

DIAPER WITH A CONSCIENCE: By the time a child is toilet trained, a parent will change between 5,000 and 8,000 diapers, adding up to approximately 3.5 million tons of waste in U.S. landfills each year. Whether you choose cloth or a more environmentally-friendly disposable, you are making a choice that has a much gentler impact on our planet. Truly, diapering is a tough issue. Do what you can to save the impact on our earth.
