Pastor's Page

One of the living saints of this church has a funny saying that used to puzzle me. This person often shows up at funerals and memorial services of people he only knew casually. When asked why he feels the need to attend these gatherings he responds: If you want people to come to yours, you have to go to theirs!

On one level this statement is verifiably false. Dead people don't get to go to other people's funerals. It is impossible. And yet it is also incredibly true. If you want people to come to your funeral you have to be connected and in relationship with others. People who have big funerals are not just people with big families, but also people who have been able to maintain relationships and connections with others. If you want people to come to your funeral, you have to go to theirs.

The problem is, it is so easy to be alone these days. I hear this from just about every age group. From the college student struggling to make connections on the new campus. From the senior living alone after their spouse has died. From the parents busy raising young kids who are so exhausted at the end of the week they simply fall half asleep in front of the tv. From the parents whose kids flew the coop and now have to find new ways to be together as a couple. From the 20 and 30 year olds who wonder how do I meet people I might actually like and want to date and perhaps even marry. It is so easy to be alone these days.

Marked within the pages of the newsletter are at least 21 ways for you to connect with God's people. As one of the creation stories reminds us, it is not good for us to live alone (Genesis 2:18). We know this is true. We crave connection, but it is hard and quite honestly difficult these days to be in relationship with one another. We humans are wonderful, quirky, complicated people. And being in relationship with one another requires real work on our part. Yet as Covid showed us, the alternative, each of us sitting in our homes living life through a screen, is not healthy either. So come and connect.

I'll end with a two-part challenge. First, the next time you are in worship, during the passing of the peace or at the end of the worship service, find one person you do

not know and introduce yourself. Don't smother them with your life story, just introduce yourself. Build one connection. Being in worship is one of those wonderfully strange moments like being a first year freshman on campus — there are people everywhere, but you still feel very alone. So next time you are in worship reach out to someone new.

Second, if you want bonus points, do the same thing at Coffee Fellowship. I can tell you even today after 30 years of ministry, Coffee Fellowship is the most stressful part of my week. Let's face it, we get in routines and kind of cliquey sometimes. Even after 20 years of being in this congregation, I still get a little nervous walking into the Fellowship Hall for coffee (and I'm the pastor!). Imagine how difficult it must be for people who are new, or shy? So the next time you are in Coffee Fellowship go up and introduce yourself to someone. Don't tell them your life story, simply build a connection so that the next time you go, you know one more friendly face. And if you want even more brownie points, invite someone from worship to join you for Coffee Fellowship.

It is not good for us to be alone. As Ecclesiastes 4:12 says: "Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken." Together may we be the body of Christ.

Learning Community: Sojourner Truth

Rev. Dr. Nancy Koester, author and historian, will present a discussion about Sojourner Truth, abolitionist and women's rights advocate. Sojourner Truth was born into slavery in the state of New York in 1797. Around the age of 30, she became a traveling preacher who spoke for human rights as God's gift to every person. During the Civil War, Truth went to Washington DC to meet Abraham Lincoln and to work with the freed people. Truth supported many social reforms based on her belief that God loves all people equally.

Copies of Koester's book, We Will Be Free: The Life and Faith of Sojourner Truth (2023) will be available at the event and are on Amazon. It is not necessary to read the book prior to the event.

FAQ: Children and Communion

When do children begin taking Communion?

At First Congregational Church, children begin participating in Communion at different ages. Some children are pre-school age, others are in elementary school, and some wait until confirmation to begin taking Communion. Our practice is to include children when they and their parents think they are ready to participate.



How will I know when my child is ready?

Some parents choose infant Communion for their children. Many parents wait until their children express an interest. Typically children are ready to participate in Communion when they begin asking questions about the sacrament. One important theme of Communion is inclusion: All are welcome at the table of the Lord. If a child feels excluded or is interested in participating, it is a good time for that child to begin taking communion.

My child does not yet receive Communion. Should she/he still come forward?

Yes! Everyone is invited to come forward to the servers at the Communion distribution time. Children who will not be communing should keep their hands folded (as opposed to reaching out). This is a signal to the pastor and deacons that the child desires a blessing.

What should I say to my child about Communion?

First Congregational Church has a book and guide for families about Communion. Please talk with Pastor Stacy.

Endowment Grants

Each quarter the Endowment Grant Committee meets to evaluate proposals for new ministries and projects submitted through our church committees. Does your group have a new idea you want to pursue? Is there a need in the church or community your group wants to address? Consider applying for an Endowment Grant! The group has \$12,400 to award this year. All proposals must come from a committee and the last date for submission is: **December 10.** Forms can be accessed through the church office or on the church website under 'connect' then 'forms' tabs.

Second Holy Land Tour

In 2019, 24 people from church participated in a Holy Land Tour to visit important places in our Christian faith like Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and Galilee. We also learned about the cultural and political struggle between Jews and Palestinians and how the three great religions of Judaism, Christianity and Islam literally converge in Jerusalem.

How to Practice Box Breathing

Box breathing is exceedingly simple to practice. Simply relax your body and do the following:

- Let out all of the air in your lungs to the count of four.
- Keep your lungs empty for a count of four.
- Inhale for a count of four.
- Keep your lungs full for a count of four.

That's it! You can vary this in a few different ways. You can invite in the silent repetition of an affirmation by syncing it with your breath rather than counting to four.

Another variation is to visualize four sides of a box changing to a new color, one after the other, or in a line as though the box is being traced by a colored pen you hold with your mind, making this into a visualization exercise.

serve and for the people who participate in them. Our hope is that everyone will have an opportunity to participate at some point, but especially our teens.


