














Norway Fast Facts:

5.4 million people—about same as MN and WI 4.5 million Americans claim Norwegian ancestry 500,000 non Norwegian immigrants Long and narrow country Only 3% of the land is farmed About the size of the state of New Mexico Lots of mountains, fjords and water Oil– Sovereign Wealth Fund 1.5 billion (\$255K pp) Leads the world in electric cars 85% of the cars sold in Norway are electric Lots of people live outside main cities Expensive—but you can still visit wisely





What is Norway in a Nutshell?



Train from Oslo to Myrdal (5 hours) Cog Train down to Flam (1 Hour) Ferry thru Gudvangen (2 hours) Bus to Voss (1 Hour) Train to Bergen (90 minutes)

Cost? About \$200 via agency Do it yourself early about \$120














Stave Churches

Used to be between 1200-2000 of these churches Today there are 29 Oldest is from about 1150 Used Viking skills from boatbuilding to build churches Highly susceptible to fire and deterioration—made of wood Very dark—almost no windows



















Fjords: Sognefjord and Geirangerfjord



Norway Travel Tips

- Rent an electric car you will save lots
- You will never speak Norwegian
- You will never use cash—the Norwegian currency is....
- It is expensive..
- But you can manage it if you prepare
- Driving is wonderful and frustrating
- You will be taking LOTS of ferries
- Take out and supermarkets are your friends
- Alcohol will not be your friend (driving and cost)
- Add 30 to 50% more time to every driving direction
- Everything is closed on Sunday (almost)
